In our 6.3 years of living in (Denver & Longmont) Colorado, a lot happened during that time: we started our marriage, endured seminary, moved 4 times, bought 2 houses, had 2 boys, adopted a yellow lab, Jamie was ordained, worked with 3 great churches, and hiked/skied/snowshoe'd a lot of trails/mountains (not exactly in that order!). Did you know that over 62 million people in the U.S. still do not have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Sadly, that number grows larger and larger each year. Based on our research, more than 190,000 of those people live in the Little Rock metro area. St. Andrews Church, located on the southwest side of Little Rock, has a desire to reach as many people as possible with the Gospel. Church planting is one of the best ways to reach the lost since it sends disciples out to them.

St. Peters Church will be its first church plant. After a season of discernment, it was decided that I (Jamie) would serve as the leader of this new church plant, starting this August, located in North Little Rock. Fortunately, we already have a wonderful core team living in the same area of town that want to see people freed by the Good News. As the numbers grow and disciples are equipped to make more disciples, we will begin corporate worship gatherings. Our goal is to officially launch in 2015—Lord willing. Our hope is not just to plant a church but to make disciples that plant *more* churches all over Pulaski County and beyond for the glory of God!

The Scriptures tells us that, "without faith it is impossible to please God". So it is by faith that we plan to step out of the "boat" to go and make disciples; believing Jesus will provide for us and the work He has called us to do. We would love to have you partner with us in making disciples thru this church plant, either prayerfully and/or financially. Please consider how the Lord would have you partner with Him and us in fulfilling the Great Commission in North Little Rock. Let us remember that in supporting this ministry the fruit will be accredited to you as well (Philippians 4:17).

We hope to be fully supported by the new church plant by the end of 2017. We need to raise an annual amount of \$7,000 (totaling \$21,000 over a 3 year period). All gifts exceeding \$21,000 will go to St. Peter's general church plant fund.
